Background – QLD camping context





The Freedom Camping Act 2011 permits camping in selfcontained vehicles on all QLDC controlled/managed land.



The Reserves Act 1977 prohibits freedom camping on land classified as 'reserve'.

1 (formal) NZTA freedom camping site

All other NZTA land currently permitted for freedom camping 13 Doc camping areas - either free or low cost (approx. \$15/night)

18 Commercial Campsite/Holid ay Park 1 QLDC freedom camping site (Luggate Red Bridge)

1 New Zealand Motor Caravan Association camping site

0 LINZ freedom camping sites

Freedom Camping Act 2011 and freedom camping bylaws



Freedom camping bylaws can restrict or prohibit freedom camping to protect:

- >the area
- > health and safety of people who may visit the area
- > access to the area.

Bylaws can not:

> manage freedom camping on private land> consider impacts on private land.

Bylaws may not apply blanket prohibitions.

Draft bylaw – key aspects



Key aspects of the draft bylaw:

- 1. 15 specific restricted freedom camping areas
- 2. Rural roads (roads outside of built-up areas) identified as restricted freedom camping areas
- 3. Urban roads (roads within built-up areas) identified as prohibited freedom camping areas
- 4. Council may temporarily prohibit, restrict or change conditions in any restricted freedom camping area (i.e. events)
- 5. Council may provide consent to temporarily freedom camp in an area where freedom camping is otherwise prohibited or restricted

Specific restricted freedom camping areas



>Specific areas where freedom camping is enabled subject to identified conditions – identified in schedule 1A of the draft bylaw.

Specific restricted freedom camping areas - Conditions

- > use a certified self-contained motor vehicle
- > use one of the marked motor vehicle spaces within the area
- > must not arrive in any of the spaces before a specific time in the evening (time will be site dependent)
- > must leave any space before a specific time in the morning (time will be site dependent)
- > ensure any motor vehicle, camping equipment and any other personal items are fully contained within one of the marked spaces
- > not stay more than two nights within any 30 day period, and not return to any of the marked spaces within a 30 day period;
- > not leave any waste
- > not light any fires outside of the motor vehicle

Rural roads



- > Roads in the district's rural areas are identified as restricted freedom camping areas
- > Freedom camping is enabled on these roads
- > Freedom camping must comply with the conditions in Clause 8.3 of the draft bylaw
- > Identified in schedule 1B of the draft bylaw

Rural roads restricted freedom camping areas - Conditions

- > use a certified self-contained motor vehicle;
- > ensure that the side or part of the motor vehicle closest to the road (that is the carriageway) is located a minimum of 5 metres from the nearest edge of the road hard shoulder (where provided) or edge of seal (where no hard shoulder) at all times;
- ensure that the motor vehicle is positioned in a location to ensure any other person can stop their motor vehicle in the immediate area at all times for any other purpose (i.e. other than for freedom camping);
- ensure that the motor vehicle is only positioned on a formed gravel or sealed surface;
- > ensure any camping equipment and any other personal items are fully contained within 2 metres of the motor vehicle at all times, on a side of the vehicle away from the carriageway
- > not stay more than 2 nights within any 30 day period, and not return to any location within 500 metres of a location where the person has previously freedom camped
- > not leave any waste
- > not light any fires outside of the motor vehicle





> Roads in the district's urban areas are identified as prohibited freedom camping areas.

> Freedom camping can not be undertaken on these roads.

>Includes roads within built up town centres, residential areas, commercial and business areas.

> Identified in Schedule 2 of the draft bylaw.
